Welcome to the Ex-LGBT

I'd like to ask a question. Since the LGBT redefined marriage in 2013, they have taken over the education system so that all our children will be taught LGBT. They have also coerced the venues for Franklin Graham's evangelistic tour into cancelling so he has to book up new ones. Will society keep on going relentlessly in the same direction, or will there be a turning of the tide back to normality? I think it could be the latter, because of the increasing number of people who are abandoning the LGBT lifestyle and finding another way.

We have always known about ex-gays, it was an issue that was highlighted during the London Bus Case when Transport for London (TfL) put up an advert from Stonewall saying "*Some people are gay. Get over it!*" and the Core Issues Trust attempted to respond with their own advert saying "*Not gay! Ex-gay, post gay and proud. Get over it!*". However their response was blocked by Boris Johnson who was Mayor of London and Head of TfL at the time.

The belief that people are born with a sexual orientation is crucial to the LGBT because it supports their claim for rights as a protected group under equality legislation. So the existence of people who are 'ex-gay' is anathema to them, they must be opposed at all costs.

Who are the Ex-Gays?

There have always been people who used to be same-sex attracted, but until recently very few of them went public about it. Same-sex attraction happens to some people during puberty, then it passes and they become attracted to the opposite sex, get married and raise a family. For others it's a bit more persistent and they need counselling to identify the underlying causes, often associated with abusive or dysfunctional families.

They used to write their stories anonymously so they could put it all behind them and get on with their lives.¹ But now there are increasing numbers of ex-gay and ex-trans people publishing their stories openly on the internet, together with their names and photographs. The reason they do so is because they see young people treading the same path as themselves, heading for the same potential disasters, and they want to try and rescue some of these people.

How does sexuality go wrong?

Children are impressionable, they can go wrong due to simple misunderstandings. For example a class at school gets taught about LGBT and how good it is, and a child has

a best friend of the same sex and thinks he must be gay because he can't differentiate between sexual love and friendship. Or a teacher sees a child doing something more characteristic of the opposite sex, as most children do sometimes, and suggests that the child must be transgender. Or there might be parents who wanted a boy but they got a girl, so the girl tries to be a boy to fulfil their expectations. Each of these scenarios can lead to a child getting invited to the gay club at some stage and finding lots of new friends who are much better than the dysfunctional family they came from. But after a while the novelty wears off and they feel a sense of emptiness, and it's a high-risk lifestyle that might leave them with serious damage such as HIV infection and transgender surgery.



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Reaching the Lost

Most of the currently published ex-gay and ex-trans people are evangelical Christians and they say that Jesus has set them free from same-sex attraction, or from gender confusion as the case may be. However, they don't go to gay pride marches shouting through loud megaphones about how disgusting it all is. Instead they preach about love because they understand that the reason why people are gay or trans in the first place is because at some crucial stage in their lives, the right kind of love was missing. All they need is to be shown a few acts of kindness, and for many it will be enough to get them started resolving their issues.

A lot more could be said about the ex-LGBT. They come from all over the world and their stories are all unique but have a lot in common, in terms of how they got into the gay lifestyle and how they got out of it. From these stories you can come to your own conclusions about what makes people gay, but they are all in agreement that nobody is born that way. Click here:
